Thomas Ravenscroft was a musician, chorister at St Paul's Cathedral, London, and a collector of folk music. He published three collections, Pammelia, Deuteromelia and Melismata, from which this carol is drawn. He also published a book of metrical psalms.

There are several versions of these words, some of them with solemn warnings to repent.

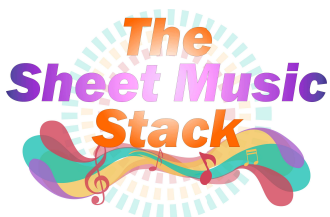
